What Is Prayer?

Prayer is a biblical mandate and our spiritual obligation. We are commanded to pray, with faith, petitioning God for what we want and need. Prayer is not only a formidable defense against our own flesh, but a powerful weapon to combat the enemy of our souls. Through prayer, we have direct access to God and the power of His presence. Prayer is our practical connection to heaven and supernatural link to the divine.

When we pray, we have the ability to change the trajectory of our own futures. We have the power to infiltrate the spirit realm and destroy Satan's strongholds. We have the capacity to engage God's heart and influence His decisions. We can pray with the authority of His Word as we ask for our needs and intercede for others.

Ultimately, prayer is a resignation of our own wills and a surrender to Christ's kingdom rather than a list of grievances or a campaign for our own desires. We must surrender to God's will and submit our own hearts and desires to His purpose. Through the power of prayer, we can live as Christ has called us to live and fulfill His purpose here on earth.

Why This Booklet?

A new year gives us a fresh start, and in 2026 our Pastor is asking us to renew our commitment to prayer. Concerning methods of prayer, Scripture is our greatest guide. His Word gives us patterns for approaching Him. When the disciples asked, "Lord, teach us to pray," Jesus gave us the Lord's Prayer (Matthew 6:9–13; Luke II:2–4). Another helpful model is the Tabernacle Plan taught by Bishops G.A. and Anthony Mangun. Whatever the method, any plan that helps you pray is valuable.

This booklet, however, is not a prayer plan but a set of prayer concepts to unify us as we begin the first 21 Days of this year with intensified prayer. The first week touches on some of the cornerstones of praying with power, while the second week encourages us to make the commitment to trust Him with all things. In the final week, you will find daily prayer focuses designed to unite us as we collectively seek God's will in each of these areas.

You will notice that each prayer prompt is followed by Scriptures. These are provided so that you can easily engage in what is perhaps the most effective way to pray: praying His Word. We encourage you to speak the Scriptures aloud during your time of prayer. When you do so, we have faith that you will witness how His Word builds faith, changes the atmosphere, and affects the situations you bring before Him. His Word will not return void (Isaiah 55:11).

Praying with Power January 1 - January 7

The first requirement for praying with power is recognizing that, apart from Him, we have no power at all. He alone is the source of all strength, and anything accomplished through our prayers happens because we exercise the measure of faith He has given each of us (Romans 12:3). To pray with power is to pray with expectation.

Throughout Scripture, God teaches us how to pray with boldness and authority. In Mark, He instructs us to believe that we will receive what we ask for. In Hebrews, we are called to approach His throne with confidence. The prayer prompts for Days 1–7 highlight additional principles of powerful, effective prayer. As we move through this week together, let us unite our faith and believe God for great things.

God, I will ask all things in Your name.

God, I thank You for the revelation of who You are. With that knowledge, I will remember to ask all things in Your name: the name of Jesus. You are the first and the last, the Alpha and Omega and beside You there is no other. With Your death on the cross, You purchased the opportunity for me to enter into eternal covenant with You through obedience to Your Word, thus giving me access to the power of Your name.

Scriptures

John 14:13-14

And whatsoever ye shall ask in my name, that will I do, that the Father may be glorified in the Son. If ye shall ask any thing in my name, I will do it.

John 16:23-24

Whatsoever ye shall ask the Father in my name, he will give it you. Hitherto have ye asked nothing in my name: ask, and ye shall receive, that your joy may be full.

Mark 16:17

And these signs shall follow them that believe; In my name shall they cast out devils; they shall speak with new tongues;"

Colossians 3:17

And whatsoever ye do in word or deed, do all in the name of the Lord Jesus, giving thanks to God and the Father by him.

God, I will praise You.

God, I praise You for who You are. The goodness of Your works are beyond measure. When I look at the beauty of the world You have created, I am astonished at Your power. When I consider the design of the Universe, from the vast Milky Way to the imperceptible atoms that form matter, Your greatness is beyond mortal comprehension. Yet, You have chosen to be mindful of us. I praise You, God, for Your power, Your might, Your creativity, and most of all, for Your great love for us. I will not be silent in my praise to You, our King.

Scriptures

Psalm 100:4

Enter into his gates with thanksgiving, and into his courts with praise: be thankful unto him, and bless his name.

Psalm 150:6

Let every thing that hath breath praise the LORD. Praise ye the LORD.

Psalm 34:1

I will bless the LORD at all times: his praise shall continually be in my mouth.

2 Chronicles 20:21-22

...When they began to sing and to praise, the LORD set ambushments against the children of Ammon, Moab, and mount Seir...

Acts 16:25-26

And at midnight Paul and Silas prayed, and sang praises unto God... and immediately all the doors were opened, and every one's bands were loosed.

God, I will be thankful.

I thank You, Mighty God, for Your everlasting kindness to me. Though I have failed You many times, You still call me Your child. When it is I who should be faithful to You, it is You who has been faithful to me. I never want to forget to thank you for the things I sometimes take for granted: my health, my food, and my shelter. I don't want to forget that You are my provider and every good and perfect thing comes from You. I thank you for the blessings of family and friends and our church community. Even in the difficult times: in times of loss and times of trouble, I still thank you, God. You have never failed me, nor left me in the valley of despair.

Scriptures

Philippians 4:6

Be careful for nothing; but in every thing by prayer and supplication with thanksgiving let your requests be made known unto God.

1 Thessalonians 5:18

In every thing give thanks: for this is the will of God in Christ Jesus concerning you.

Colossians 4:2

Continue in prayer, and watch in the same with thanksgiving;

Ephesians 5:20

Giving thanks always for all things unto God and the Father in the name of our Lord Jesus Christ;

God, I will repent.

God, forgive me for my faults and failures. I am sorry for when I have sinned against You or my fellow man. As I search my heart, God, reveal to me the wrongs that I have committed. Let me not defend, justify, or explain my behavior when I feel conviction. Instead, God, I want to confess my wrong-doings and ask for Your forgiveness, for I know you are merciful, and when You forgive my sins, You remember them no more.

Scriptures

Psalm 51:10

Create in me a clean heart, O God; and renew a right spirit within me. (You may want to read the entire chapter of Psalm 51 as it is a psalm of repentance.)

1 John 1:9

If we confess our sins, he is faithful and just to forgive us our sins, and to cleanse us from all unrighteousness.

Proverbs 28:13

He that covereth his sins shall not prosper: but whoso confesseth and forsaketh them shall have mercy.

Romans 2:3-4

And thinkest thou this, O man, that judgest them which do such things, and doest the same, that thou shalt escape the judgment of God? Or despisest thou the riches of his goodness and forbearance and longsuffering; not knowing that the goodness of God leadeth thee to repentance?

God, I will have compassion.

God, I pray for my family and friends and fellow church members. My desire is to show them compassion and understanding like You have done to me. I pray for the burdens that they carry, seen and unseen. I pray for their quiet struggles and their private heartaches. I pray that You would heal broken relationships and give us compassion one to another. Lord, help me to forgive any offenses I have experienced just as You have forgiven me. I pray that You bless us as Your children and cause us to dwell in Your love and unity.

Scriptures

Galatians 6:2

Bear ye one another's burdens, and so fulfil the law of Christ.

Ephesians 4:32

And be ye kind one to another, tenderhearted, forgiving one another, even as God for Christ's sake hath forgiven you.

Colossians 3:12

Put on therefore, as the elect of God... bowels of mercies, kindness, humbleness of mind, meekness, longsuffering;

Zechariah 7:9

Execute true judgment, and show mercy and compassions every man to his brother:

1 John 4:11

Beloved, if God so loved us, we ought also to love one another.

God, I will pray with fervency.

God, I resist the temptation of making my prayer a routine item on a checklist. Awaken me to the truth that our prayers truly change the future. Help me pray passionately and earnestly as I invite you into every situation in my life. With Grace, I want to accept Your sovereignty and Your will. I will truly trust that You have good plans for me. Help me to cultivate the gift of praying in the Spirit as I intercede for others. I am only flesh and bone and do not fully know what I should pray, so I ask that You allow Your Spirit to flow through me, as Paul said, "making intercession for us with groanings which cannot be uttered," (Romans 8:26–27) for I know that the effectual fervent prayer of the righteous avails much.

Scriptures

James 5:16

Confess your faults one to another, and pray one for another, that ye may be healed. The effectual fervent prayer of a righteous man availeth much.

1 Corinthians 14:14-15

For if I pray in an unknown tongue, my spirit prayeth... I will pray with the spirit, and I will pray with the understanding also.

Jeremiah 29:13

And ye shall seek me, and find me, when ye shall search for me with all your heart.

Jude 1:20

But ye, beloved, building up yourselves on your most holy faith, praying in the Holy Ghost.

God, I will be persistent.

God, I thank you for the spirit of adoption that gives me the right to call You my Father. Your Word says we often lack blessings because we fail to ask, so I am asking, Lord, that You bless and guide me. I will not beg, but I will persistently seek Your intervention and provision. Through the parable of the unjust judge in Luke 18, You taught me that consistent asking brings a response. Like the widow, I am confident that You alone can change every situation and answer every request. I will not lose faith or hope. I will once again pray over situations and people I had stopped praying for. I will continually petition my King.

Scriptures

James 4:2

Ye lust, and have not: ye kill, and desire to have, and cannot obtain: ye fight and war, yet ye have not, because ye ask not.

Luke 18:7

And shall not God avenge his own elect, which cry day and night unto him, though he bear long with them?

Luke 11:8-10

I say unto you, Though he will not rise and give him, because he is his friend, yet because of his importunity he will rise and give him as many as he needeth. And I say unto you, Ask, and it shall be given you; seek, and ye shall find; knock, and it shall be opened unto you. For every one that asketh receiveth; and he that seeketh findeth; and to him that knocketh it shall be opened.

Praying with Trust January 8 – January 14

When Jesus gave the framework for prayer in the book of Matthew, He began with an example of surrender: "Thy kingdom come, Thy will be done in earth, as it is in heaven" (Matthew 6:10 KJV). Trusting God means surrendering our lives and our circumstances to His will and giving up our own need to dictate the future or command our situations. When we choose to trust God, we allow Him to work according to His timeline and His sovereign purpose.

The strength of our trust is measured by how faithful we are in difficulties and hardships. Trusting God is easy when we experience financial success, good health, and strong relationships; but, when we are devastated by misfortune and adversity, it is hard to believe that God is near and He is capable of working all things out for good. The prayer prompts for Days 8-14 challenge us to place our hearts in His hands through prayer and trust that He will bring us through our trials triumphantly.

God, I trust You with my time.

God, I trust You with my time. I will designate part of each day for You because You are worthy to receive my praise and adoration. I know that I need daily communion with You in order to keep my flesh under subjection and my mind focused on Your kingdom. You have given me this day, so I will surrender a portion of it back to You in prayer. I know that You will bless the sacrifice I make.

Scriptures

Luke 18:1

And he spake a parable unto them to this end, that men ought always to pray, and not to faint;

Ephesians 6:18

Praying always with all prayer and supplication in the Spirit, and watching thereunto with all perseverance and supplication for all saints;

Colossians 4:2

Continue in prayer, and watch in the same with thanksgiving;

1 Thessalonians 5:17

Pray without ceasing.

1 Timothy 2:1

I exhort therefore, that, first of all, supplications, prayers, intercessions, and giving of thanks, be made for all men;

James 5:6

Confess your faults one to another, and pray one for another, that ye may be healed. The effectual fervent prayer of a righteous man availeth much.

God, I trust You with my need for control.

God, I surrender my will and need for control to You. You have the ultimate authority over my life, and I trust You with every part of it. I release my need to control people, situations, and outcomes. I will allow You to work things out according to Your will and purpose. I trust that Your plans are better than my own.

Scriptures

Proverbs 3:5-6

Trust in the LORD with all thine heart; and lean not unto thine own understanding. In all thy ways acknowledge him, and he shall direct thy paths.

Matthew 16:24

Then said Jesus unto his disciples, If any man will come after me, let him deny himself, and take up his cross, and follow me.

Psalm 37:5

Commit thy way unto the LORD; trust also in him; and he shall bring it to pass.

Luke 22:42

Saying, Father, if thou be willing, remove this cup from me: nevertheless not my will, but thine, be done.

God, I trust You with my reputation.

God, I trust You with my reputation. You are in control of my life and the outcome of all my circumstances. When people speak evil against me or have ungodly intentions toward me, I will rest in the knowledge that You have the final say over my life. I will seek to have good character and a right attitude before You so that I am blameless and above reproach. I will forgive those who do wrong against me and speak negatively toward me. I believe that You are my defense and shield.

Scriptures

Matthew 5:39

But I say unto you, That ye resist not evil: but whosoever shall smite thee on thy right cheek, turn to him the other also.

Luke 6:22-23

Blessed are ye, when men shall hate you, and when they shall separate you from their company, and shall reproach you, and cast out your name as evil, for the Son of man's sake. Rejoice ye in that day, and leap for joy: for, behold, your reward is great in heaven: for in the like manner did their fathers unto the prophets.

John 15:19

If ye were of the world, the world would love his own: but because ye are not of the world, but I have chosen you out of the world, therefore the world hateth you.

For so is the will of God, that with well doing ye may put to silence the ignorance of foolish men:

God, I trust You with my anxiety.

God, I surrender my anxiety to You. All of the fear I have over my future, I give it to You. When I am overwhelmed with my responsibilities and apprehensive about the things I cannot control or change, I will turn to You for peace and assurance that You will not leave me or forsake me. When dread grips my heart and fear debilitates me, I will remind myself of Your goodness and mercy and faithfulness. I trust You with all of the possibilities of my circumstances. I believe that You are worthy of my trust, and You have a beautiful design for my life.

Scriptures

Isaiah 41:10

Fear thou not; for I am with thee: be not dismayed; for I am thy God: I will strengthen thee; yea, I will help thee; yea, I will uphold thee with the right hand of my righteousness.

Matthew 11:28-29

Come unto me, all ye that labour and are heavy laden, and I will give you rest. Take my yoke upon you, and learn of me; for I am meek and lowly in heart: and ye shall find rest unto your souls.

Philippians 4:6-7

Be careful for nothing; but in every thing by prayer and supplication with thanksgiving let your requests be made known unto God. And the peace of God, which passeth all understanding, shall keep your hearts and minds through Christ Jesus.

2 Timothy 1:7

For God hath not given us the spirit of fear; but of power, and of love, and of a sound mind.

God, I trust You with my unbelief.

God, I acknowledge my lack of faith and unbelief and trust You with all of my doubt. Help me overcome the unbelief I have. Dismantle the negative thoughts that tell me You will not come through for me and lies that say You do not hear me. Your Word promises that You are faithful and steadfast. Help me to believe the truth that You will work all things out for Your glory and my betterment.

Scriptures

Mark 9:24

And straightway the father of the child cried out, and said with tears, Lord, I believe; help thou mine unbelief.

Hebrews 11:1

Now faith is the substance of things hoped for, the evidence of things not seen.

Hebrews 11:6

But without faith it is impossible to please him: for he that cometh to God must believe that he is, and that he is a rewarder of them that diligently seek him.

James 1:6-8

But let him ask in faith, nothing wavering. For he that wavereth is like a wave of the sea driven with the wind and tossed. For let not that man think that he shall receive any thing of the Lord. A double minded man is unstable in all his ways.

God, I trust You with my disappointments.

God, I surrender my disappointments and difficulties to You. When things do not work out like I think they should, when I do not receive the answer I prayed for, I will still trust that You have not failed me nor forgotten me. I believe that You will use my circumstances for Your glory. I trust that You will not waste my hurt and disappointment; You will not forget my pain or tears. In due season, You will turn all of my sorrow into joy.

Scriptures

Psalm 27:13-14

I had fainted, unless I had believed to see the goodness of the Lord in the land of the living. Wait on the Lord: be of good courage, and he shall strengthen thine heart: wait, I say, on the Lord.

Thou hast turned for me my mourning into dancing: thou hast put off my sackcloth, and girded me with gladness;

Psalm 34:16-19

I trust You with my family, my future, and my heart. I will submit my life to Your timeline and design. You are faithful and merciful and good. Your promises are true, and You are worthy to be trusted.

Praying with Focus January 15 – January 21

Praying with focus is an element of prayer that requires a bit of time and discipline. Praying with focus requires us to shut out all the noise of our intrusive culture. We must put our phones away, take a moment to clear our minds, and engage in quiet thought and reflection. Increasingly, with technology and the effect it has on our lifestyle, this has become a more difficult task.

Responsibilities, commitments, schedules: all good things, but they can intrude on our godly intentions. Praying with focus also requires us to say "no" to our easily distracted flesh, and take a deep dive into our own minds. "What are my most immediate needs? What are the most immediate needs of my church family?" Write these things down, so that every day you can focus on these things in prayer. Writing the items down also has the added benefit of allowing you to record when God answers your prayers.

During this third week of our 21 Days of Prayer, we are calling all POA members to join in unified focus. Scripture teaches us repeatedly, that in unity, there is power. Let us, as a congregation, take advantage of this holy principle and pray as one. Imagine what God will do for our church and our community if we will all take a few minutes each day to petition the Lord with one voice and one request.

Today we pray for our POA families.

God, today we pray for our POA families. Thank you for the people we hold most dear. We pray for protection and direction over every POA Family. Cover each family with Your blood and shelter them from evil and harm. Lead each family member according to Your will and purpose. When relationships within our families become complicated or difficult, when we don't know what to say or do, we will turn to You for guidance on how to handle challenging situations. Bless our families with peace and unity according to Your goodness and mercy and rebuke the spirit of discord.

Scriptures

Numbers 6:24-26

The Lord bless thee, and keep thee:

The Lord make his face shine upon thee, and be gracious unto thee:

The Lord lift up his countenance upon thee, and give thee peace.

The Lord lift up his countenance upon thee, and give thee peace.

Acts 16:11

Believe in the Lord Jesus, and you will be saved, you and your household.

Psalm 121: 7-8

The Lord will keep you from all harm—he will watch over your life; the Lord will watch over your coming and going.

Job 42:10

God, today we pray for our church. Give us divine direction and spiritual discernment. Bind us together in love and unity. Eliminate division and dissension so that we may display the love of Christ to each other. Help us to discard any jealousy, bitterness, and resentment that we have toward one another, and let our hearts be filled with compassion, kindness, and empathy as we work together in Your kingdom. We pray for each ministry leader at POA. Allow all ministries to function together as members of one body. Make us effective with our resources and our time and bless us with workers in the field.

Scriptures

Cease not to give thanks for you, making mention of you in my prayers; That the God of our Lord Jesus Christ, the Father of glory, may give unto you the spirit of wisdom and revelation in the knowledge of him: The eyes of your understanding being enlightened; that ye may know what is the hope of his calling, and what the riches of the glory of his inheritance in the saints,

Ephesians 4:3

Endeavouring to keep the unity of the Spirit in the bond of peace.

Ephesians 6:18

Praying always with all prayer and supplication in the Spirit, and watching thereunto with all perseverance and supplication for all saints.

Colossians 1:9

For this cause we also, since the day we heard it, do not cease to pray for you, and to desire that ye might be filled with the knowledge of his will in all wisdom and spiritual understanding

Today we pray for our pastors.

God, today we pray for our pastors. You have appointed them as our spiritual leaders, and we pray that You guide and direct them as they lead our congregation. Like you did for Joseph, as they seek Your favor, give them favor with men and cause whatever they seek to do for Your kingdom to prosper. Protect each of our pastors and their families. Give them direction and knowledge, wisdom and focus. Grant them health and mental clarity. Visit them with Your peace. Help us to know how to uplift and support them in their work for Your Kingdom.

Scriptures

But Moses' hands were heavy; and they took a stone, and put it under him, and he sat thereon; and Aaron and Hur stayed up his hands, the one on the one side, and the other on the other side; and his hands were steady until the going down of the sun.

And the spirit of the Lord shall rest upon him, the spirit of wisdom and understanding, the spirit of counsel and might, the spirit of knowledge and of the fear of the Lord;

1 Thessalonians 5:12-13

Today we pray for our community.

God, we pray for our community. We ask that You would destroy spiritual strongholds of crime, addiction, and corruption. Bless our community with businesses and resources. Help POA to be "a city on a hill" to Central Louisiana. Use each of us to minister to the hurting and broken in our community and to show forth Your love, drawing the lost to salvation. Help us to embody the message of Your Gospel. Anoint and direct our local leaders and help them lead with wisdom and understanding.

Scriptures

Isaiah 1:17

Learn to do well; seek judgment, relieve the oppressed, judge the fatherless, plead for the widow.

Mark 9:41

For whosoever shall give you a cup of water to drink in my name, because ye belong to Christ, verily I say unto you, he shall not lose his reward.

2 Corinthians 10:3-5

For though we walk in the flesh, we do not war after the flesh: (For the weapons of our warfare are not carnal, but mighty through God to the pulling down of strong holds;) Casting down imaginations, and every high thing that exalteth itself against the knowledge of God, and bringing into captivity every thought to the obedience of Christ;

Ephesians 6:10-12

Finally, my brethren, be strong in the Lord, and in the power of his might. Put on the whole armour of God, that ye may be able to stand against the wiles of the devil. For we wrestle not against flesh and blood, but against principalities, against powers, against the rulers of the darkness of this world, against spiritual wickedness in high places.

Today we pray for our prodigals..

God, today we pray for those who have strayed from Your Truth. We pray that You would draw them back to You and remind them of Your goodness and mercy. Convict them when they are misguided and confused. Mercifully lead them back to the safety of Your arms. Mend the relationships that have been broken and redeem the time that has been lost. We know that You are able to restore and deliver from any situation no matter how bleak it may seem to us. Help us to be kind and compassionate, not judgmental or unmerciful. As prodigals find their way back to You, let us welcome them with love.

Scriptures

Luke 15:20

And he arose, and came to his father. But when he was yet a great way off, his father saw him, and had compassion, and ran, and fell on his neck, and kissed him.

Galatians 6:1

Brethren, if a man be overtaken in a fault, ye which are spiritual, restore such an one in the spirit of meekness; considering thyself, lest thou also be tempted.

2 Peter 3:9

The Lord is not slack concerning his promise, as some men count slackness; but is longsuffering to us-ward, not willing that any should perish, but that all should come to repentance.

Luke 22:31

God, today we pray for our state and nation. Bring peace to Louisiana and America. In the name of Jesus, we ask that you silence and bind spirits of division and violence. Help us, the Church, to set an example of love and mercy. Protect and anoint our state and national leaders. Give them wisdom beyond their human ability. Help them to seek after Your will and purpose. Let Your Kingdom come and Your will be done in America. Bless our nation with prosperity that it might be used to continue to spread the gospel. Heal our land as we turn toward You.
